

Exam Correction Quiz Directions.

Purpose:

The purpose of this assignment is to reflect on your mistakes, to correct each non-fully correct answer, and to reflect on your performance with the goal of using this reflection to make adjustments to your study habits so that you may improve your performance for the next exam.

Directions:

1. Print out as many copies of page 1 as needed to correct all but the last 6 incorrect problems of your exam.

2. Put your name, course and exam number on top of your first Page 1. Staple all correction pages together. loosely place your exam inside, but not staple it to your correction pages.

This will be due at the beginning of the class period, and may not be accepted after the start of class.

3. You will correct **every** problem which is marked with an x or has a point deduction. This includes all extra credit problems. In the first column, copy the incorrect problem number, write out the problem, and your incorrect work. With a hi-lighter, hi-light where the mistake you made is. Failure to do this may result in a loss of points.

4. In the second column, show the correct work and box your now correct and final answer.

5. In the third and final column, classify or describe what the cause of your mistake was.

6. After you have corrected all incorrect or partially incorrect problems, on Page 2, write a reflection paragraph that to help you reflect and summarize what you have learned from correcting your exam. You will need to comment on three things to help you improve your study habits for future exams. You will describe what you 1. You should start doing. 2. What you should continue doing, and 3. what you should stop doing in order to be more successful on future exams.

Grading:

This assignment is a quiz, it is worth 10 points and falls into the quiz category of your grade. This quiz is mandatory. The points do not add to your exam grade at all, but will help your overall course grade by getting a good score on this assignment.

If you do not include your exam with this sheet, and place it loosely inside your stapled correction quiz, you will lose 2 points from your overall grade on the quiz.

You will lose 1 point for each problem that you did not correct but was marked incorrect or partially incorrect on your exam. You will lose 1 point for each problem that you correct but still got the problem incorrect.

If you lose 5 points in total in this section, no further checking will be completed.

You will earn 5 points for providing earnest completion of your reflection paragraph and for addressing the 3 topics of reflection. These topics are to describe what:

1. You should start doing. 2. What you should continue doing, and 3. what you should stop doing in order to be more successful on future exams

Failure to complete this reflection paragraph in whole or in part will result in full or partial loss of these 5 points.

Together, the corrections are worth 5 points and your reflection paragraph is worth 5 points making this a 10 pt. quiz
